### **Level I: Description**

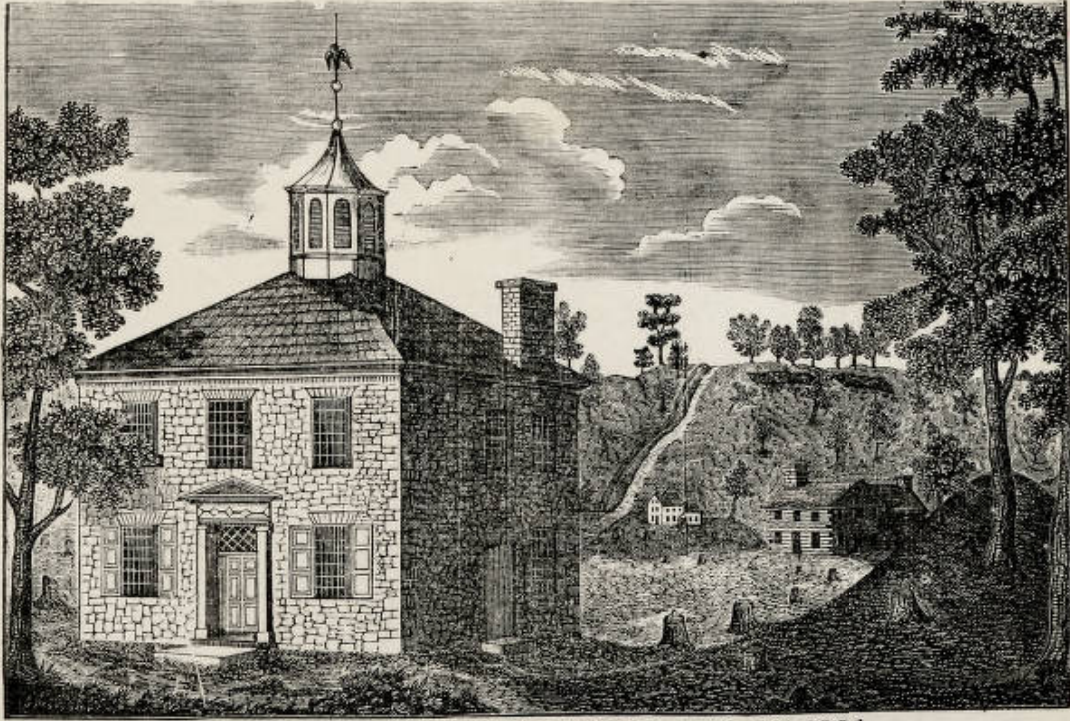
1. What do you think this building was used for?

3. Where was the capital of Ohio moved to in the year 1810?

### **Level II: Interpretation**

1. From what language was the word Chillicothe taken?
2. Explain why Chillicothe was the capital of Ohio two different times.

### **Level III: Analysis**

1. Why was Chillicothe chosen to be the first state capital?
2. Why was the state capital moved from Chillicothe to Zanesville?
