



Description: 1973 saw the start of an oil crisis when oil producing Middle Eastern countries (Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and Syria) and Egypt and Tunisia in Northern Africa began an oil embargo in response to America's support of Israel in the Yom Kipper War. The countries issued the embargo (under OAPEC) against the U.S., U.K., Canada, Japan, and The Netherlands. The embargo caused gas prices to skyrocket, having an effect on not only U.S. economics, but world economics as well. It lasted until March, 1974.










