

Before the civil war, southern enslaved people lived in family units. One or two-room cabins located in the slave quarters usually housed one family each. Here in the small cramped indoor spaces, in the yards surrounding each cabin, and in the unpaved lanes, slave families tried to fashion a private life for themselves that allowed each member to be more that a slave.
