Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the photograph while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. Describe the boat pictured in the photograph.
- 2. How many people are in the photograph?
- 3. What else do you see in the photograph?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. When do you think this photograph was taken? When do you think this type of boat was used?
- 2. Why do you think the mules are near the boat?
- 3. How do you think the covered structures on the boat were used?
- 4. What do you think the material is in the uncovered part of the boat?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. What does the photograph tell you about how goods were transported at this time in Ohio's history?
- 2. What jobs do you think the men pictured would do while on the boat?
- 3. What problems do you think the men using this boat would have had while on the canal?
