### Primary Source Citation: Advertisement, Dayton Daily News, April 13, 1944.

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the advertisement while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

## Level I: Description

- 1. What do you see in this advertisement?
- 2. What type of store is being advertised?
- 3. What do you notice about the prices of the items?

# Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Are the prices higher or lower than what they are today?
- 2. Do you recognize any of the products?
- 3. What is a shorter name for an advertisement?

# Level III: Analysis

- 1. What else would the advertisement have to tell us so we could shop there?
- 2. Are any of the products items we still use today?
- 3. Can you explain what tooth powder is and what do we use today for the same purpose?
