- 2. Looking at the materials used to make this building, where do you think it was built? What makes you think this way?
- 3. What do you notice about the architecture?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. What do you think it was like to live in this house?
- 2. Would you like to live in the time this house was built?
- 3. Is there anything you would have done differently to this house if you were building it now?
- 4. Compare the two structures? How are they different? How are they the same?
