Level I: Description

- 1. Who is featured in this picture?
- 2. What are some symbols you see in this picture?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. What time period do you think this picture came from?
- 2. Look at the woman's facial expression in the picture. How would you describe her expression? Why?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. Why do you think the man and women are portrayed like they are in the picture?
- 2. Do you think the symbols used in the picture were effective?
