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Grade level: 8

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the painting located at the above link while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. What is powering the boats in the painting?
- 2. What cargo is included in the boats?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. What is making the crossing difficult?
- 2. Were there any alternate methods to get the army across the river?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. Do you believe this image is an accurate portrayal of the crossing? Why or why not? Cite evidence from the painting.
- What would you predict would have happened if the British/Hessians discovered George Washington's plans and attacked during the crossing?
