Level I: Description

- 1. Do you recognize any of the people in the painting?
- 2. What is happening in the painting?
- 3. What kind of weather are the men in the painting facing?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Why would General Washington have his men out on a night like this one?
- 2. There are many boats in the background of the painting. Why did the artist choose to focus on the boat at the forefront of the painting?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. What does this painting tell you about the soldiers in the Continental Army?
- 2. Do you think the conditions shown in the painting helped the Continental Army to be successful in the attack? Explain.
