Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the objects pictured at the above link one at a time while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. Why do you think his mouth is open?
- 2. What are other special or interesting features of the artifact? What might these features represent?
- 3. What might the artifact be made from?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. What kind of activity might the prehistoric Ohioans have been engaged in while using this artifact?
- 2. How do you think the Adena people made these objects?
- 3. What sort of person do you think the Adena individual who was buried with the pipe was to his people? Why?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. Do you think this mound's land owners should have been allowed to use the mound for agricultural purposes? Why or why not?
- 2. Why is it important for archaeologists and historians to study and interpret the lives of prehistoric Indians?
