## Grade level: 5

**Primary Source Citation**: Family doing piecework in tenement photograph by Lewis Wickes Hine, circa 1908, from *Our United States* (Silver Burdett Ginn, 1997) 346.

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the photograph while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

## Level I: Description

- 1. What are the adults in the photograph doing?
- 2. What are the children in the photograph doing?
- 3. Describe the surroundings in the picture.

## Level II: Interpretation

- 1. How was this different from what the family may have expected about coming to America?
- 2. Do you think this immigrant family settled in a rural or urban area? Why?

## Level III: Analysis

- 1. How do you think this family felt about their new life in America?
- 2. How much pay do you think the family received for their work if the garment was damaged?
- 3. What does this photograph tell you about the immigrant experience?
