Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the photograph while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

## **Level 1: Description**

- 1. List five things about these children that are different from you today.
- 2. List two things about these children that appear similar to you today.
- 3. State something you notice about the photograph that helps you better understand the time period?

## **Level 2: Interpretation**

- 1. Describe what might be going through the minds of the children in this photograph?
- 2. Compare their first few moments in America with the last few weeks aboard the ship.
- 3. Compare this photograph to a photograph of your family. What things are similar and what things are different?

## Level 3: Analysis

- 1. Look ahead...Compare the lives that the children probably knew to the reality of the life they will likely encounter in America.
- 2. Select 1 person in this photograph. Write a one-page journal entry as if you were this child and you've just arrived at Ellis Island. Use information from our lessons to add details to your journal entry.
