Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the broadside located at the above link while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. When and where was this notice posted?
- 2. What kind of businesses were being closed early?
- 3. What time must the businesses close?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Why were these businesses chosen? (Hint they all sell the same item.)
- 2. Why would that item cause some concern for law enforcement in that area?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. Were you surprised to find out that there were many Confederate supporters in Ohio?
- 2. Why would people who live in a "free" state like Ohio support the Confederacy?

That all Saloons, Groceries, Taverns, Drug Stores, and all other places where Liquor, of any kind, is sold in Bucyrus,

SHALL BE CLOSED,

AT 9 O'CLOCK THIS EVENING, and kept closed until Wednesday morning, the 8th inst.
