Grade level: 4

Primary source citation: <u>On to Liberty</u> by Theodore Kaufman, 1867 in *Ohio* (The New Enchantment of America State Bks.). Chicago: Children Press, 1978.

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the painting while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level 1: Description

- 1. Who do you think the artist is portraying in the painting?
- 2. Where and when (setting) do you think this painting takes place?
- 3. What do you think the people in this painting are doing?

Level 2: Interpretation

- 1. Can you explain what is happening in this painting?
- 2. What do you think the artist was trying to portray in this painting?
- 3. What questions would you want to ask the children in this painting?

Level 3: Analysis

- 1. What inferences/conclusions can you draw from this painting? Any predictions?
- 2. What evidence in this painting can you use to support your predictions? Be specific.
- 3. How would you compare this painting to Addy and her mother's adventure in the book we just completed, *Meet Addy*: *An American Girl*? (I would have students do paintings based on *Meet Addy* before I share this painting and then compare them)
