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Grade level: 6, used in conjunction with a story in L.A. (*The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle* by Avi, 1997)

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the painting while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. Based on our vocabulary, where are the mast, ratlines and rigging?
- 2. What kind of weather was being shown in the painting?
- 3. What else can you see in the painting?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Could this be a type of ship Charlotte was on? Why?
- 2. If this was Charlotte's ship, would the weather have affected her climb?
- 3. Does the picture help you understand the trial Charlotte was going through?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. Look at the mast. Why do you think they chose that for Charlotte's test?
- 2. Why do you think that men primarily worked on these ships?
