Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the document located at the above link while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. Who are the people in this illustration?
- 2. What does this illustration represent?
- 3. Who are some of the other people in this illustration?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Looking at the picture, about what time period in history do you think this event took place? How can you tell?
- 2. Where is this event taking place? What clues in the picture made you think that?
- 3. Why do you think the publisher decided to print this illustration on the front cover of this magazine?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. What do you believe the people in the line are thinking? Why?
- 2. Who do you think the white man is behind the doorway? What do you believe he's thinking at this moment? Why?
- 3. What do you think some of these people do for a living? Explain your answer.
