Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the advertisement located at the above line while answering the questions below in order. These questions will prepare students to think critically when observing primary source documents, particularly photographs.

Level I: Description

- 1 What is the purpose of the announcement?
- Where and when does the sale seem to be happening?
- What does the author of the announcement want everyone to know about the slaves to be sold?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1 Who was the intended target group that this announcement hoped to reach?
- 2 How does the author of the announcement describe the Africans?

Level III: Analysis

- 1 Describe the most important thing someone attending this sale might be concerned with.
- 2 Describe something that the sale announcement does not tell you about the Africans.
