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Grade level: 4

Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the text while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. What kind of document is this?
- 2. Do you recognize any of the animal drawings? If so, what animals do you see?
- 3. Why are there animal drawings on this document?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. Why do you think the American Indian leaders signed using pictographs?
- 2. There seems to be something embossed in the lower left hand corner. How do you think that was created?
- 3. How old do you think this document is?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. What pictograph would you use to sign your name?
- 2. Does this source tell you anything about how American Indians were treated?
- 3. Do you think this kind of document would work in today's society? Why or why not?
