Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the painting located at the above link while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

## **Level I: Description**

- 1. How many people do you see in the picture?
- 2. What other things do you see besides people?
- 3. What time of year does it appear to be?

## **Level II: Interpretation**

- 1. What do you think the child in the foreground is doing?
- 2. Notice the black child. Why do you think the artist included children in this painting?
- 3. What is the importance of the season to this picture?

## Level III: Analysis

- 1. What emotions do you think are conveyed by this painting?
- 2. What does this photograph tell you about the Underground Railroad?
- 3. This painting was first shown at the Columbian Exposition in 1893. Why do you think this famous painter chose to exhibit this work at the World's Fair?
