Allow students, in groups or individually, to examine the painting while answering the questions below in order. The questions are designed to guide students into a deeper analysis of the source and sharpen associated cognitive skills.

Level I: Description

- 1. What do you see in this painting?
- 2. How would you explain what is happening?
- 3. What details do you see in the painting?

Level II: Interpretation

- 1. What is different about how the people are dressed compared to today?
- 2. Can you explain how they traveled?
- 3. What is the main idea of the painting?

Level III: Analysis

- 1. How is this related to the story we read ("Follow the Drinking Gourd")?
- 2. What is the relationship between the people? Who are the travelers and who lives in the house in the background?
- 3. Can you predict what will happen? To whom? Why?
- 4. How do you think the people felt at the very moment in the painting? How would you feel if you were one of them?
