Level II: Interpretation

1. What aspects of William Henry Harrison did this campaign focus on?
2. How did William Henry Harrison run his campaign during the election of 1840? Compare this to the election of 1824.

Level III: Analysis

1. During the mid-1800s, what were people looking for in a president?
