Descrip This photograph documents a scrap drive display in Akron, Ohio during World War II. Recycling and scrap metal drives were one of

the ways Americans supported the war effort during the Second World War.

As steel and other materials were needed to make ships, weapons, and other tools for

the war effort, Americans were called upon to recycle goods that were

not deemed essential. Government-

produced posters, radio commercials and advertisements encouraged scrap drives, which were ofte

n sponsored by schools or community groups.
